

University of Detroit, History.—The University of Detroit began its educational work in 1877 and was incorporated April 27, 1881, according to the laws of the State of Michigan under the title of "Detroit College," with power to grant such literary honors and confer such degrees as are usually conferred by similar colleges and institutions of learning in the United States. A re-organization was effected in 1911 and incorporated under the title of the "University of Detroit." Since that time various departments were added—the College of Engineering before the close of the same year; the School of Law the following year, 1912. The Evening College of Commerce and Finance was begun in 1916; the Day College of Commerce and Finance was opened in 1922. Graduate degrees were conferred for the first time in 1885, but the fuller organization of graduate studies was not effected until 1927, when a Graduate Division was established. In 1950 this became the Graduate School. The School of Dentistry was established in 1932. The evening classes in Arts and Sciences and in Engineering were inaugurated in 1930, and the McNichols Road Evening Division was formally organized as a separate unit of the University in 1945. Departments of education, journalism, social science, foreign trade, etc., were added at various periods. In January, 1945, an affiliation was effected with the Detroit Institute of Musical Art.

Steiner, S.J., U. of D. president, announced a \$20,000,000 development program to be known as the anniversary fund program. Immediate objectives were:

(1) Memorial (field house, armory and physical education) Building. This \$2,500,000 building was financed by an alumni fund raising drive. It was dedicated May 25, 1952.

(2) Residence Hall. Approval of a \$900,000 government self-liquidating (to be paid back through rental fees) loan was received in the fall of 1953. Construction will begin in 1954. The building will house 316 students. With the present Holden Hall (200 capacity) campus dormitories will house 30 per cent of the out of town students.

(3) Activities Building. To supply dining, student office, ballroom and banquet facilities. A \$1,700,000 project.

In 1950 a Students' Activities Building Fund committee was organized. Future carnival (see Spring Carnival) profits were earmarked for this fund. Students imposed a \$1 per capita per semester tax upon themselves. Various student activities also contributed funds. To date, students contributions include:
