



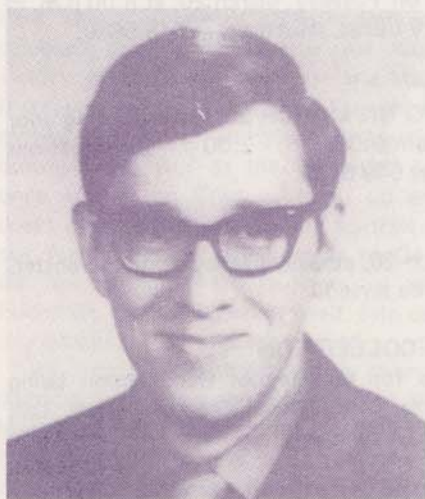

### GUEST HOMILIST AT 4:30 P.M. MASS

Mike Daly is the last homilist in our series of guest homilists for the spring. Mike is an ordained acolyte and is presently in his third year of theology at St. John's Seminary in Plymouth. Mike graduated in 1970 from Sacred Heart Seminary College, and in addition to his studies at St. John's, he has pursued a course of studies in Ethics at the University of Detroit.

Mike has been active in the Religious Education Program at St. Edith's Parish in Livonia for the past few years. Working in the largest Christian Formation Program in the Diocese has given him an opportunity to work in various strata of parish life — with adults, teen-agers and children; with parents preparing their children for the sacraments and with the liturgy itself.

We express our sincere gratitude to all the men who have shared their insights into the Gospel with us. We also extend our thanks to Fr. Myers for letting us be a part of their program.

I'm sure that we all welcome Father Hayes home this weekend. He should have many new insights to share with us from his studies in Rome, and I'm sure that his homilies will now be spiced with some Oriental seasoning.

On the other hand we bid farewell to Father Traub. He stopped by last week and picked up his worldly belongings. With U-Haul in tow, he set out for the East - his home. Father Traub is now stationed at St. Vincent Medical Center, (Port) Richmond, Staten Island, New York, N.Y. 10302. He seemed to be fit as a fiddle and ready to play a new role in God's service. I'm sure that he helped a great many of you while he was at the Shrine. Remember it is never distance that destroys friendships, but forgetfulness.

Father Ruskowski has really been a blessing to our parish. Always an excellent preacher, he once more interjected some of his creative skill into last week's Masses. With the aid of six Orchard Lake students, Father Ruskowski dramatized the theme, "Commitment to God," which should be the aim of our own Lenten practices. The young men performed two brief scenes from the play "Becket." Saint Thomas Becket was a man who struggled with his own identity. Ultimately, he had to decide between the worldly dreams of his royal friends and the spiritual direction of God. It was a decision that led to his death at the altar. That is what the Season of Lent is about. Lent is the Season for demonstrating our fidelity to God. Lent is a sincere effort to live according to God's covenant, not according to our convenience. Lent is an admission that I need a Savior, other than myself.

The Season of Lent is a drama. By our Christian vocation we are called to be a part of this drama. Our role is to move the thoughts and hearts of men in the direction of God. Sunday we were the spectators who applauded the efforts and the work of others. Each day we must be the disciples dedicated to fasting, prayer, and good works. Sundays we gather around Christ as He gives Himself to us. Each day like dedicated apprentices we strive to do His work and give of ourselves. Christ calls us not to applaud His work, but to do it: to give glory to God and be at the service of men. The conclusion of the Lenten drama will be determined by how well we fulfill our role in the days ahead.

# LITURGY

## HOME MASSES DURING LENT? NO ENTRANCE HYMN AT SUNDAY MASS DURING LENT? AN EXPLANATION. COMMUNICATION.

Twice a week during Lent, small groups of the faithful will gather with their priest in one of their homes and celebrate together the mystery of Jesus' victory over sin and death — the Mass. Increased spiritual involvement would be motive enough to initiate this practice during Lent. But as the Eucharist was once carried on Corpus Christi up and down every city street in the countries of our forefathers to pay homage to God, we are bringing the fullness of the Eucharist, the saving event itself, into our city blocks to pay homage to God.

We expect that most parish council districts will have the Sacrifice of the Mass celebrated in their area during this Holy Season. We leave the arrangements up to the people of each district and their representatives. For our part as priests, we believe not only will God be honored and adored to the limits of our parish boundaries, but also a saving awareness will be kindled in the minds of all. Participants should come to greater understanding of the PLACE of their apostolate, of their service to God. They should be reminded of the POTENTIAL FOR FAITH existing in their homes and

neighborhoods. And having consecrated in a family setting, participants should be reminded of the COUNTLESS WAYS they should consecrate their homes and neighborhoods, reflecting the unity and peace God promises to all who love Him.

The Sunday Lenten Masses in our church begin without an entrance hymn. We convene in silence. We become aware of one another's presence, the presence of our priest, the reason we assemble, all in silence. We are employing this device to emphasize the penitential part of the Mass during this Penitential Season of Lent. We hope to heighten the awareness of the emptiness in each one of us where God should be. We hope, further, to relate in some graphic way the spiritual journey of our Baptism to the spiritual journey which Lent is. For we are actually going over the same ground. In Baptism we began to share in Jesus' victory over sin and death. In Lent we admit we have so often lost our way, straying from Jesus. Jesus' victory has not become our victory over these terrifying realities. We go over the same ground to rediscover our Savior.

Theodore Petri moved that the minutes of February 12 be approved as presented, seconded by Jack Crusoe the motion passed.

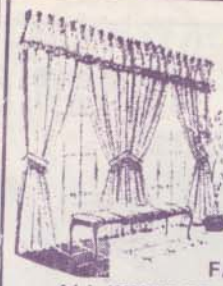
## COMMISSION REPORTS
