## Sharing the Good News

### THE LAITY AND EVANGELIZATION

A lot of us have been raised in a parish experience where the priests and sisters did the "holy work," and the rest of us, the laity, just came in for our fill-up; a kind of gas station church, with religious being the attendants and the rest of us the customers.

If we want to find a reason why the church is suffering in so many areas, we probably would do pretty well to start right there.

That was never our Lord's plan for church. It was never our Lord's plan for parishes. It was never His plan for clergy or for laity, because we are all baptized into Christ's body, and into his ministry of celebrating God's presence, of speaking God's word, and of sharing in God's kingship.

The Church's recognition of Evangelization — sharing the good news that Jesus is everything he promised, and inviting one another to grow closer to him in every way — as the primary ministry for Catholics through the next thousand years is recognition that we are all, together, the church. And all called and anointed to be Evangelists.

ArchBishop Patrick Flores writes: *"All people are called to Evangelization, even those who seem most 'unlikely.'*

*"Evangelists are very ordinary people, witnessing among ordinary persons who live and work around them, sharing with them their own story of coming to a new experience of joy and freedom.*

*"Evangelization flows out of a consciousness of what God has done...and a burning desire to have others experience this God, too.*

## Eucharistic Adoration Anniversary Sunday

There is a book on the shelf immediately above my typewrite. The book is "The Treasury of Catholic Wisdom" and the author is Fr. John Hardon, S.J. Fr. Hardon will be the preacher this Sunday evening, February 18, at 7:00 p.m. in Shrine Church as we celebrate the second anniversary of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in our parish.

The book to which I refer is a compilation of thoughts of time honored thinkers and theologians on matters essential to the Catholic faith throughout the centuries. It is a compilation of the works of scholars, yet at the same time the compilation of thoughts of holiness. Fr. Hardon, as a theologian, always seeks union with God, not esoteric minutiae that may or may not be interesting.

At the risk of making the man seem more important than the message, I want to give you some background on Fr. Hardon. He holds a master's degree in philosophy from Loyola University and a doctorate in theology from the Gregorian University in Rome. He has taught at the Jesuit School of Theology in Chicago and has been professor at the Institute for Advanced Studies in Catholic Doctrine at St. John's University, New York. He is the author of "The Catholic Catechism", "Modern Catholic Dictionary", "Pocket Catholic Dictionary", and "Question and Answer Catholic Catechism". Fr. Hardon is also a founder of the Catholic Home Study Institute, a correspondence school which operates under pontifical approval. Above all, Fr. Hardon is a man of faith and spirituality who wishes to share his love of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Please come. Bring a family member or two for an evening of prayer, procession, benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and inspiration, February 18, 7:00 p.m. in the main church.

## Shrine Stewardship

Part of our stewardship responsibility as a Catholic parish is the wider diocesan church operation, involving those things that an individual parish cannot do on its own. Here in the Detroit Archdiocese, as in many places, there is a diocesan collection. Ours is the Catholic Services Appeal. While there will be much more about this in the next couple of months and while the appeal does not officially begin until May 6, we are already gearing up.

Next Sunday there will be a brunch meeting of group leaders. We aim to increase the number of group leaders this year as well as the number of home visitors.

Individual parish quotas/targets have not yet been assigned. However, we have been notified that our base amount will be somewhat reduced by \$1,208.00. As with other parishes, we will still be assigned the percentage increase that applies across the board.

One of the unexpected (read unbudgeted) items this year has been the discovery of old oil tanks on parish properties. We did some test borings on one tank site last week and are awaiting results of the dirt samples before proceeding with the tank removals. The tests might take a few weeks. The tanks must be removed according to law.

Thank you for your continuing stewardship, your sacrificial sharing of time, talent, and treasure. Such high spirited sharing was evident last Monday evening in the Ladies Guild card party and in the Grades School Dads' Club meeting. Come and see how many high spirited horses there are in the Shrine Stakes this coming Saturday. It's a time to share our fun, too.

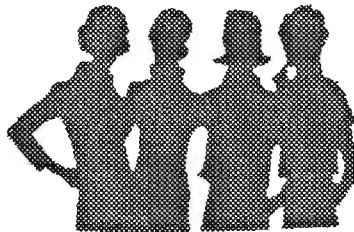

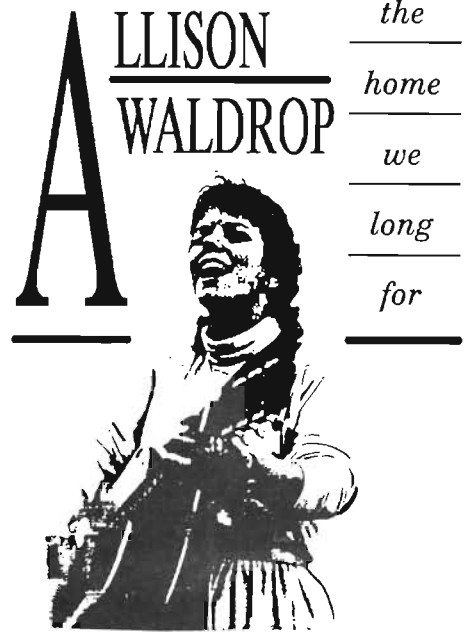

## Building Your Child's Self-Esteem

- 5. Spend time with your children.** Do things together as a family. Designate a family night or family morning that begins with Mass. ## Spiritual Direction Available at Shrine

Just two weeks ago Fr. Haggerty wrote an article in the Herald introducing me and the ministry of spiritual direction to the Shrine community. I'd like to take a few minutes now to tell you how happy I am to be here and to explain briefly what I hope to do at Shrine.

Spiritual direction (sometimes called spiritual dialogue or companionship) is an ancient tradition within the Church with roots in the earliest centuries after Christ. Formerly available almost solely to priests and religious, the 25 years since the 2nd Vatican Council have seen more and more people being trained in this ministry, thus making spiritual direction available to lay people as well.

The central question the spiritual direction relationship deals with is, as the noted Catholic writer Henri Nouwen writes, "How can I remain aware of God's presence in my life?" The spiritual director does not offer set answers to questions such as this; rather, by engaging in ongoing dialogue, both parties in the dialogue attempt to discern just what God is calling this particular person to do and to be. God deals individually with each and every person, and spiritual direction can help each one of us:

—to discover what the Gospel message means to me in making decisions about work, family, or relationships;

—to find the best way for me to pray;

—to know that my life is lived in accordance with God's will and not just in response to my impulses.

Are there any prerequisites to seeking out spiritual direction? Only that you want to grow in your life with the Lord.

Another type of spiritual direction occurs in groups. We are hoping to be able to offer a variety of group opportunities to Shrine parishioners in the future: days of recollection, classes or workshops on prayer and the spiritual life, ongoing group spiritual direction, etc. I am eager to offer such programs, and would welcome working with any parish group or organization to develop a prayer experience with you.

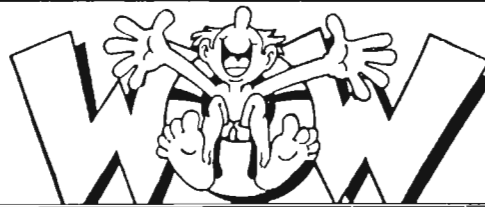

### "10 Ways to Develop Self Esteem in Your Child"

1. **TEACH YOUR CHILDREN THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WHO THEY ARE AND WHAT THEY DO.** Children must feel valued apart from their activities. They must know we love them simply because they exist.
2. **ENCOURAGE BEHAVIOR.** Be specific and describe how your child's behavior effects you. Say, "I like your drawing. It reminds me of a field where I used to play." Rather than "You're a good artist." Don't fear that encouragement will generate conceit. Conceit is a whitewash to cover low self-esteem. Children who sense their true worth do not have to use time and energy impressing others.
3. **ACCEPT YOUR CHILDREN AS THEY ARE.** "Your child is not a second chance for you to accomplish all those things you did not do during your earlier life." Allow mistakes.
4. **Walk the fine line effective parents must walk. TOO MUCH PRESSURE LEADS CHILDREN TO THINK, "I CAN NEVER PLEASE MY PARENTS. I can never measure up. I'm not good/smart/fast/skilled enough."** Too little encouragement on the other hand, leads a child to conjecture, "They don't think I can do it. I must not be very capable."
5. **IGNORE OR REMAIN NEUTRAL TO FAILURE.** Don't punish failure. Don't ignore success.
6. **REWARD THOSE THINGS YOUR CHILD IS ABLE TO CONTROL.** First of all, however, you must provide opportunities for control. If children are able to exert some control over some of the events in their lives, they gain some immunity against the adverse effects of unpleasant events they are powerless to control.
7. **TEACH YOUR CHILDREN TO ENCOURAGE THEMSELVES.** Say "You really worked hard decorating your room. How do you like the way it turned out?"
8. **HELP CHILDREN TO EVALUATE REALISTICALLY.** "Let's see, how much that you feel you have improved?"
9. **BE AVAILABLE.** Whenever possible, attend your children's plays and recitals. Be prepared to sometimes play the role of "surrogate friend" when your child is friendless for whatever reason. Your availability, along with encouragement, may be the strength he or she needs to reach out to a new friend.
10. **NURTURE YOUR OWN SELF-ESTEEM.** Take time to do the things that you enjoy.

## Local Nuns are Election Monitors

Two local nuns are among 52 religious nationwide who have been chosen to observe the process and help monitor the results of elections later this month in Nicaragua.

Sr. Marie Michael, OP, and Sr. Ann Wisda, IHM, will join with the Detroit area's third religious representative, United Methodist minister, John Wallace of Redford, when their delegation travels to Nicaragua for the national elections scheduled for February 25.

According to the two sisters, religious throughout the United States were contacted by the Inter-religious Foundation for Community Organization (IFCO), an umbrella group that sponsors several social justice projects within Central America. Theirs will be one of the largest observer delegations, and perhaps the most geographically extensive, with delegates in 10 Nicaraguan cities on both coasts and in the war zones as well as in Managua. The delegation also has a unique vantage point: because it is rooted in contact with Nicaraguan Catholic and Evangelical church organizations, observers will have unique and direct access to the voice and experience of the common people, as well as opportunities for theological reflection and dialogue.

Sr. Michael, who served as a missionary in Managua from 1981-85, was forced to leave Nicaragua when she became ill and was unable to receive proper medical treatment. An economic boycott against Nicaragua by the United States government prevented, among other things, medical supplies from entering the country.

### PRAYERS ASKED FOR PEACEFUL ELECTION

Area churches are being asked to hold vigil on the day of election to pray for peace in order that Nicaraguans can go to the polls in freedom from violence and without bloodshed. Here at Shrine our hours of vigil will be from 3 - 6:00 Sunday afternoon, Feb. 25. You will be invited to sign up for one hour during that time. Tables with sign-up sheets will be at the doors of the church this weekend. If you have not signed up and find that you will be able to come, come anyway. There will be prayers at about the middle of each hour, repeated during the next hour. Come and pray for peace for the people of Central America.

Bread for the World is introducing into Congress this week the 'Harvest of Peace Resolution' which seeks to slow the arms race and promote peaceful development.

Specifically, the Christian citizens movement is seeking a \$20 billion cut in U. S. military spending, with a use of at least half of that saved for programs to aid low-income people. The rededicated funds would help overcome poverty through such programs as Food Stamps, WIC, employment and training, Head Start, and low-income housing assistance.

Bread for the World also seeks a 10% cut (\$500 million) in military foreign aid, and a 20% cut (\$900 million) in military arms sales, with the money being transferred to the most effective Third World development programs.

Throughout the metropolitan Detroit area, dozens of church communities are holding letter-writing campaigns in support of this resolution and its specific budget goals. All interested parish and social groups are invited to join.

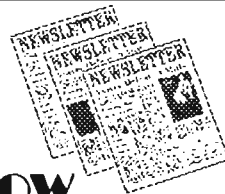

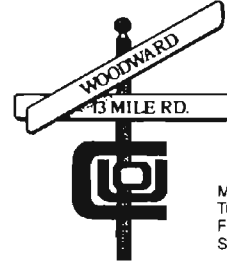
